
#### **Copernicus Educational Products**

By working with Copernicus, you too help us achieve our goal of protecting and rehabilitating nature for future generations.


In 2016 we spent over \$150,000 on environmental and humanitarian causes and projects.

115,000 trees would also cover approximately 250 acres



We are currently working towards designating **90 acres** with a long term conservation agreement. This land currently provides habitat for the threatened bird species, the Bobolink.




#### **Beehives**
